### EDUKANS UGANDA FOR QUALITY EDUCATION IN BASIC AND VOCATIONAL EDUCATION:

The Edukans Education programme in Uganda was implemented between 2007-2010. Edukans worked with implementing partners mainly NGOs and Faith Based Organizations in Lango and Teso sub-regions to support capacity building aimed at strengthening management and governance at the school level as well as facilitating duty bearers to carry out their mandates and to hold them accountable for monitoring and supervision of school programmes to increase access, sustained attendance and improve the quality of relevant basic education in target communities.

**Early Primary Literacy Programme (EPLP) was implemented by partner** Mango Tree from 2009 – 2011 93 persons were trained on Lango orthography. 5 tutors (4 from Loro Core PTC and 1 from Canon Lawrence PTC) were trained to deliver the mother tongue methodology and curriculum to pilot teachers. This is 33 people more than the planned target. In addition, 48 P-1 and P-2 pilot teachers trained in the Lango orthography, mother tongue methodology and curriculum. Actual training of 1,600 pupils in EPLP methodology and curriculum is planned for the year 2011.

**The Support to vulnerable children and young people to access quality basic education and alternative learning for equitable socio economic development in Lango sub- region by partner** Collaborative Efforts to Address Social Problems (CEASOP) from 2009 – 2011. From it, 300 vulnerable young people formed into 15 Savings and Loans Associations (SLAs). Otwal Outreach 80, Alito outreach 50, Ogur outreach 20. A total of 300 pupils in Okokolako Primary School were trained in agriculture and poultry. It was reported that 320 pupils were retained in schools due to interventions related to training pupils on agriculture in schools.

**Education Quality Improvement Project (EQUIP) was implemented by partner** CEREDO from 2009 –2011 to *strengthen the school governance capacity of 420 school community leaders from the 14 satellite schools in Teso.* A total of 459 school community leaders were trained in School Development Planning and all the 14 satellite schools had their School Development Plan developed.

**Mosique project 2012 - 2015** (Monitoring sharing improving quality of education) implemented in Lango sub-region by Transformation Uganda and in Teso region by Catholic Education, Research and Development Organisation (CEREDO) and Church of Uganda where Digital Learning module for PTC's was installed, 80 PTC tutors, 100 CCT supervisors, VSO education experts of UNICEF,

based at core PTC, and other interested organisations trained to teach Active Learning Techniques. over 1000 (student) teachers trained in the application of Active Learning approach and 300000 students reached with the Active Learning approach.

**Agri Skills 4 You was implemented together with ICCO** to provide educational skills, improvement of agricultural knowledge and skills and improvement of entrepreneurial skills. At the end of the financing period 7000 farmers benefited from the skills development and 75% of them will have also received business capital and coaching leading to improved employment opportunities and income.

**Civic Engagement Alliance** this was implemented together with ICCO, Kerk in Actie, Wilde Ganzen, Co-Prisma, CNV, focusing on farmers' engagement with other CSO's providing trainings in their area and duty bearers to enhance networking and strengthen their advocacy effort towards better markets.

**Equipping schools in quality control, measurement and assessment** using the EDU Q-card an online tool to assess the quality of education and monitor quality developments and EDUstars: five pillars to high quality education over 100 schools and teachers.

**Skilling Youth for Employment (SKY) programme** (2016-2020) in partnership with AVSI as lead, EyeOpenerWorks, Luigi Giussani Institute for Higher Education focused on sustainable creation of employment of youth in the agribusiness and 6000 youths from 10 BTVETs and Busitema University (Arapai) benefited.

**Agri-business programme** with Heifer International reached over 3,200 youth in Northern Uganda (Dokolo) (2018-2020) and 2 TVETs were trained on the 7 STEPs to work, active teaching and learning and agribusiness approaches.
